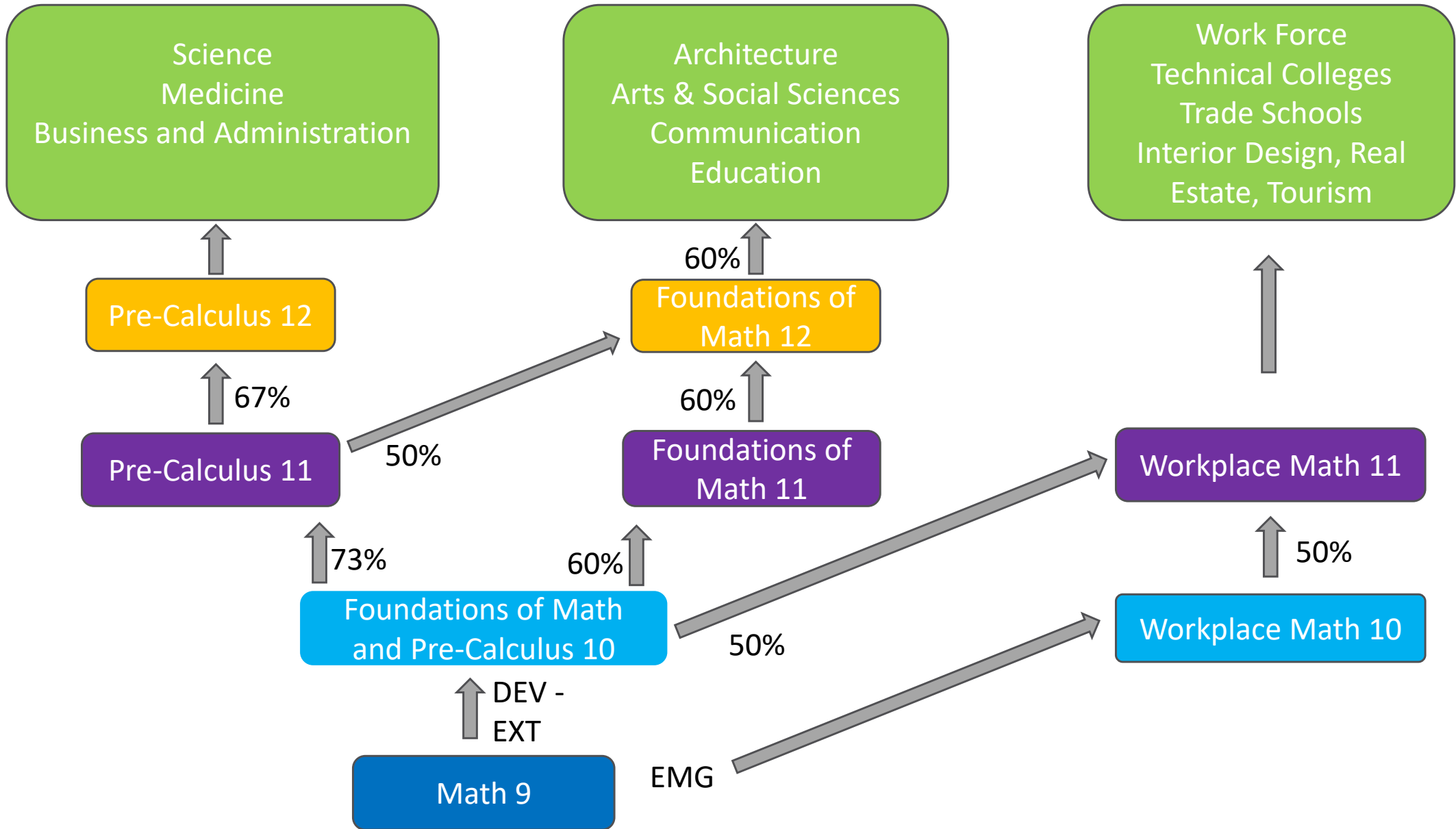

Foods Studies 10	Students bake and cook while learning about nutrition, sustainability and environmental issues related to our Food System.
Entrepreneurship & Marketing 10	Explore characteristics of entrepreneurs, challenges of entrepreneurship, and the life cycle of products and services.
Textiles 10	Students learn to sew more efficiently, creatively and professionally. Projects include a hoody and self-directed items.
Web Development 10	Explore web coding, including HTML and stylesheet coding; AI integration, photo editing, JavaScript coding for gaming; create fun and interactive games.
Woodworking 10	Skill development in cabinet construction and furniture building.

Fine Arts (ADST credit)	Description
Art Studio 10	Students explore, create, reason and reflect while developing their skills, techniques, process and strategies; focuses on growth as an artist.
Concert Choir 10	Performs challenging choral literature in a wide range of styles; performs several times in various venues throughout the year; goes on a trip every second year.
Drama 10	Covers characterization, role-playing, blocking, creative movement, choreography, voice production, stagecraft, lighting, and develops communication and relational skills.
Concert Band 10	Requires high level of performance and commitment, performs at various concerts and festivals throughout the year.

Modern Languages

Language Course	Description
Core French 10	Further develops oral and written skills; teacher and students increase communication in French over the semester; thematic units as well as cultural expressions
Spanish 10	Further develops oral and written skills, learning about Hispanic countries, communicate their thoughts in Spanish.



University Second Language Admission Requirements

At this time a second language is not required for general admission to:

- Most other BC Colleges and Bible Schools

- We encourage you to do thorough research into post-secondary requirements
- UFV, B.Arts: A grade 11 second language or equivalent is required for all students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree. Students without a grade 11 language will need to complete a first year modern language course (101) as part of their university studies.
 - You can still apply to B.Arts program at UFV without a second language 11
- Students and parents are encouraged to consider the benefits in learning an additional language
 - Language 12 is an academic grade 12 course
 - Personal growth
 - Increases global and cultural knowledge
 - Future travel, meeting new people

Prerequisites

Students must meet pre-requisites to enroll in specific courses.

If you select a course for which you do not have the pre-requisite, that class will be removed from your course selection

Not meeting a pre-requisite?

Pre-requisites are set by departments and are approved by Admin. Students must have a certain level of understanding (proficiency) to build upon or apply their learning in the next grade.

Options:

→ Retake the course to better prepare for the next grade level. The risk: you might get a better mark, but are still not prepared for the rigor and challenge of the course that you want to get into

Course	Description
Apex: Senior Leadership 10	Building on knowledge and experience in leadership, students become more involved in planning and running school and community events.
Bluesberry Jam 10	MEI's junior jazz band. Audition required.
Computational Thinking & Information Systems 12	University-credit course from January to April. An introduction to computer information systems, processing language, and game coding.
Drumline 10	For percussionists in Concert Band, to enhance their drum rudiments and cadence playing. Audition required.
Junior Chamber Singers 10	For students in Choir or Band who want to further excel in music performance. Application and audition required.

Extended Day Courses con't...

Junior Worship Leadership 10	Students learn worship theology & philosophy, practical music theory, songwriting and sound design.
Outdoor Education 11	Develops technical skills, environmental awareness, sense of community and self, leadership and planning by exploring outdoor activities such as hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, rock climbing, snowshoeing, orienteering and caving.
Student Athlete Captain's Course + Committee 10	Develops student-athletes' leadership skills, self-awareness, and teamwork while preparing them for the challenges of high school and post-secondary athletics.
Yearbook 10	Work collaboratively with others to create the school yearbook through photography, selling and developing ads, and designing page spreads, headlines and photo stories.
