- Final marks for all grade 10, 11 and 12 courses will show on your Grade 12 Ministry of Education Transcript
- Transcripts are used for admission to Universities and Colleges
- Starting in Grade 10, Everything counts!



Course Selections must allow you to meet graduation requirements

- 4 credits Socials Studies 11 or 12

• Students and parents should ensure that the required courses have been successfully completed in previous grades and that course selections for next year will ensure the student is on-track to meet graduation requirements.

• School Counsellors will review selections and may need to make changes to your schedule to ensure students have the required courses.



Required Courses in Grade 11

- Literary Studies 11 (or Honours)
- Bible 11
- One Math 11 course
- One Science course
- One Socials course
- One ADST course
- 1 2 other Courses
- (1 Study block permitted only with 5 Academic classes)

Online Courses & Study Blocks

MEI Secondary School does not give a study period in place of online courses taken. If students, or their families, choose to enroll in an online course, that will be in addition to the courses they are taking at the school, not in place of.


Students in Grade 11 are permitted to receive one Study Block only if they are taking 5 Academic courses.

University Second Language Admission Requirements

- At this time a second language is not required for general admission to:
- British Columbia Institute of Technology
- Kwantlen Polytechnic University
- Trinity Western University
- University of the Fraser Valley
- University of British Columbia (Okanagan Campus only)
- University of Northern British Columbia
- University of Victoria
- Most other BC Colleges and Bible Schools
- A grade 11 second language is not required for students transferring to SFU or UBC after completing a full year of university transfer courses at UFV, KPU, TWU or UVic, etc.

Second Language Required for some Universities

- A grade 11 second language is required for direct general admission to Simon Fraser University and University of British Columbia (Vancouver Campus).
- A grade 11 second language, or equivalent, is required for all students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of the Fraser Valley. Students without an additional grade 11 language, will need to complete a first year modern language course as part of their university studies.
- A grade 12 second language is required for all students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of British Columbia (Vancouver Campus) even if they are transferring from another post-secondary institution (PSI). Students without an additional grade 12 language must take a language as part of their university studies.
- University of British Columbia no longer takes into account a "challenged" language 12 mark as part of calculating student average of their academic grade 12 courses for admission selection purposes. However, students wanting their modern language 12 (e.g., French 12 or Spanish 12) mark to count as one of their required academics, must take the language 12 as a classroom at MEI instead of challenging it.

Successful Course Completion

- Required Courses that are not passed or successfully completed, must be repeated next year or in summer school or through an online school.
- Students must pass Bible 10 in order to return to MEI for grade 11.



Prerequisites

Students must meet pre-requisites to enroll in specific courses. If you select courses for which you do not have the pre-requisites, those classes will be removed from your course selection, unless you have submitted a completed, approved Course Permission Form.

Research Post-Secondary Admission Requirements



Certain Universities such as SFU and UBC require students to complete 5-6 approved Grade 12 Academic, Ministry-Approved, non-Board-Authorized courses. Students should ensure they have carefully researched these types of requirements.

Grade 10's enter your course requests in MyEd BC

- Each class will be called separately
- Done in the CAD Lab (Room 228)
- New Individual Login ID & Password will be given to you
- Direction will be provided on how to enter your selections in your MyEd BC account
- If you have any questions or concerns, do not hesitate to talk to a school counsellor
- After that, You can have until March 11, 2022 to make any changes in your MyEd BC account.
- After March 11, course request changes must be done through a counsellor

Keep Calm

- Don't worry if other students appear to be selecting courses ahead of you.
- At the end of the course selection process, we will compile all requests and begin to create a school timetable for next year.
- Due to the complications of scheduling 630 students, we cannot guarantee that every student will receive all of their first choices for courses. We will do our very best.
