- 9. Post-secondary options (within the context of balance, educational experiences, strengths, gifts, weaknesses, reality etc.)
- 10. University / College entrance requirements (reality vs. myth)

Grade Promotion to Grade 12 Requirements

Grade 11 Required Courses (an English 11, a Math 11, a Science 11, a Socials 11 or 12) that are not completed satisfactorily must be repeated :

- 1. at MEI next year OR
- 2. in summer school (if available) **OR**
- 3. Online

Students must pass Bible 11 in order to return to MEI the following year.

Two Graduation Assessments

- One Graduation Numeracy Assessment (GNA) that you should have written already or will be writing before the end of June
- One Graduation Literacy Assessments (GLA) to be written in Grade 12.
- Does not count as part of your Math or English school marks but will receive a proficiency rating

Elective Credits (minimum <u>16</u> credits)

Arts Education (AE) and/or Applied, Design, Skills, and Technologies (ADST)

Students must complete <u>4</u> grade 10, 11 or 12 AE and/or ADST credits in order to meet graduation requirements.

* <u>Grade 10, 11 and 12</u> *Provincially Authorized* AE and ADST ***** Courses <u>do meet</u> this graduation requirement.

* Only <u>Grade 11</u> Board Authority Authorized (BAA)
 AE and ADST * Courses <u>do meet</u> this graduation requirement, <u>not</u> Grade 10 or 12 BAAs

<u>Choosing Courses with</u> <u>Pre-requisites</u>

Course Selection should be based on a student's final mark in the required pre-requisite course, however, if the required pre-requisite course is being taken in the second semester, students should base their course selection on their final mark in the required course the previous year. Students will still need to end up with the required pre-requisite in their requested course by the end of the semester, unless a Department Head or Teacher Designate waives the pre-requisite using a <u>Course Permission Slip</u>.






External Credentials are approved BC Ministry of Education courses, programs, and assessments developed outside the regular school system.

Post-Secondary Admission Requirements

Post-secondary admission requirements vary depending on the institution and depending on the specific program.

eg. Students with a minimum <u>67</u>% average, based on English 12 and the other required grade 12 courses may be accepted to TWU, however, more recently SFU & UBC have looked at an <u>80</u>% minimum for most of their programs. Early Admission conditional offers may also be offered by some post-secondary schools, for some of their programs, using initially grade 11 final marks

<u>Approved Grade 12 Academic</u> <u>Courses/Subjects</u>

Below is a list of Grade 12 courses, offered at MEI, that are accepted as "approved grade 12 courses/subjects" for general program admission requirement purposes by SFU, TWU, UBC, and UVIC: UNDER REVIEW FOR SOME PSIs

B.C. Second Language Information



Some things to consider:

* A grade 11 second language <u>IS</u> required for direct general admission to SFU (SFU will accept an Introductory Language 11) and UBC, but is <u>NOT</u> required at BCIT, TWU, UFV, UVIC and most other B.C. colleges and Bible colleges.

 If a student completes a full year of approved transferable post-secondary courses/credits at another institution, and then wants to transfer to SFU/UBC*, SFU/UBC* will not require a grade 11 second language.

NOTE: A second language 12 (or equivalent) is <u>NOT</u> required for general admission to UBC, but <u>IS</u> required as part of their Bachelor of Arts degree program.

Scholarship & Bursary Awards

What you need to know



Why Talk about Scholarship and Bursary Awards Now?

Many award donors / organizations are interested in an applicant's achievements and school/community involvements not only in grade 12, but also prior to grade 12.

Some donor organizations require membership the year prior to applying for their award. eg. Otter Co-op Scholarships

Planning ahead and implementing new initiatives in grade 11 and 12 is likely to give an applicant a better chance of receiving an award. (Having <u>balance</u> in life is however, an important factor to consider when working toward scholarships.)

eg. Volunteering to tutor is *great*, but recognizing a need for a tutoring program in an "inner-city" Abbotsford school, initiating a tutoring program and finding all of the volunteers and putting the program in place is <u>better</u>.

<u>Criteria for Awarding</u> Scholarship & Bursary Awards

May include one or more of the following:

- high academic achievement
- leadership involvement
- extra-curricular school activities
- community service / good citizenship
- membership in a specific organization
- having specific education/career goals
- pursuing specific post-secondary studies/a specific career
- nomination and/or knowing the donor
- financial need

Abbotsford Community Foundation Awards www.abbotsfordcf.org

Awards, ranging in value from \$250 - \$3000, are available to SD #34 and/or MEI grade 12 students.

Application package includes:

- Awards checklist
- Application form (includes financial information section)
- Reference letter (adult, non-relative ~ typed, one page)
- Transcript

The online application package will likely be available in early Feb. 2020 and will be due by the end of February.

(Must be redeemed at a designated PSI within <u>18</u> months of graduating. A Social Insurance Number is required to claim awards.)

Designated Post-Secondary Schools

Most awards can only be claimed at designated / approved post-secondary schools. While not all post-secondary schools are designated, many public and private post-secondary schools, inside and outside of Canada, are designated.

B.C. Achievement Scholarships

- This \$1250 scholarship (8000 in total) recognizes broad achievement in courses meeting graduation program requirements. Criteria include:
- achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy graduation program requirements (including elective courses). Grad Transitions will not be included. A cumulative average percentage will be calculated and form the basis for awarding the BC Achievement Scholarship.
- Recipients must meet basic eligibility requirements (eg. must be a Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant), in addition to attaining a "B" (73% or above) or better average in their Language Arts 12 course.

Students do NOT apply for this scholarship.

B.C. Excellence Scholarships

The BC Excellence Scholarship is a \$5000 award recognizing 55 well-rounded graduates demonstrating community service and leadership, both inside and outside of their school, as well as commitment and aptitude for their chosen career paths.
