Graduation Program

- Final marks for all grade 10, 11 and 12 courses will show on your Grade 12 Ministry of Education Transcript
- Transcripts are used for admission to Universities and Colleges
- Starting in Grade 10, Everything counts!

• Students and parents should ensure that the required courses have been successfully completed in previous grades and that course selections for next year will ensure the student is on-track to meet graduation requirements.

• School Counsellors will review selections and may need to make changes to your schedule to ensure students have the required courses.

Online Courses & Study Blocks

MEI Secondary School does not give a study period in place of online courses taken. If students, or their families, choose to enroll in an online course, that will be in addition to the courses they are taking at the school, not in place of.

MEI Secondary School does not allow study periods for **Grade 9** and **Grade 10** students. The core subject offerings and elective classes at these grade levels are designed to give students the required courses they need and additional explorations in areas in which they may not have experience.

MEI Secondary School does not exempt students from PHE 9 or PHE 10 because they are highly engaged in athletics activities outside of the school. The "Physical and Health Education" courses at the grades 9 and 10 levels are educating the whole student on health issues as well as physical activity.

Because our ultimate academic goal is to graduate our students, MEI Secondary School reserves the right to hold all graduation-requirement courses within the timetable of the student until they can prove they have completed the online version of the course.

University Second Language Admission Requirements

At this time a second language is not required for general admission to:

- British Columbia Institute of Technology
- Kwantlen Polytechnic University
- Trinity Western University
- University of the Fraser Valley
- University of British Columbia (Okanagan Campus only)
- University of Northern British Columbia
- University of Victoria
- Most other BC Colleges and Bible Schools
- A grade 11 second language is not required for students transferring to SFU or UBC after completing a full year of university transfer courses at UFV, KPU, TWU or UVic, etc.

Second Language Required for some Universities

- A grade 11 second language is required for direct general admission to Simon Fraser University and University of British Columbia (Vancouver Campus).
- A grade 11 second language, or equivalent, is required for all students planning to complete a
 Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of the Fraser Valley. Students without an additional
 grade 11 language, will need to complete a first year modern language course as part of their
 university studies.
- A grade 12 second language is required for all students planning to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of British Columbia (Vancouver Campus) even if they are transferring from another post-secondary institution (PSI). Students without an additional grade 12 language must take a language as part of their university studies.
- University of British Columbia no longer takes into account a "challenged" language 12 mark as part of calculating student average of their academic grade 12 courses for admission selection purposes. However, students wanting their modern language 12 (e.g., French 12 or Spanish 12) mark to count as one of their required academics, must take the language 12 as a classroom at MEI instead of challenging it.

Successful Course Completion

- Required Courses that are not passed or successfully completed, must be repeated next year or in summer school or through an online school.
- Students must pass Bible 9 in order to return to MEI for grade 10.



Prerequisites

Students must meet pre-requisites to enroll in specific courses. If you select courses for which you do not have the pre-requisites, those classes will be removed from your course selection, unless you have submitted a completed, approved Course Permission Form.
