#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. <u>Download</u> *Information & Application Package.* Save the document locally on your computer. Open the saved document using <u>Acrobat Reader</u> (free software). *If using a browser to fill in the pdf, formatting may be subject to browser settings and may not format correctly.*
- 2. <u>Read through and complete</u> the *Information & Application Package* (form is digitally fillable), including the *Awards Summary Checklist* (pg. 1), *the Application Form* (pgs. 5 & 6), *and the Financial Planning Worksheet* (pg. 7)
- 3. Print out (do not email) the completed *Information & Application Package*
- 4. <u>Sign</u> page 6 (student and parent) of the *Information & Application Package*
- 5. <u>Attach</u> one reference letter from an adult, non-relative Reference letter should comment on: character, values, work ethic, accomplishments, post-secondary education and/or career related goals, community involvement etc.
- 6. <u>Hand in</u> (do not email) the application package to Ms. Ratzlaff by 3:00 p.m., March 2, 2020 (MEI will attach a transcript)
