New Course Selection Process

- No more hard copy course selection sheet to fill out and submit
- Selection is done online through *MyEducation BC* student portal
<https://www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/aspen/logon.do>
- MEI will send to Parents/Guardians Login ID and temporary Password by email on Friday March 6. You will have one week to discuss with your parents/teachers/counsellors to decide what courses you should be taking next year
- Portal opens on **Monday March 9 at 8:30 AM**
You have three weeks from then to choose, change and post (save) your courses for next year
- Portal closes on **Monday March 30 at 4:00 PM**

Purpose of Course Planning

To help students make wise decisions regarding:

- ❑ completing MEI and B.C. Ministry of Education Graduation requirements (Dogwood Diploma)
- ❑ choosing courses that will help prepare students for life after high school
- ❑ taking advantage of opportunities to use gifts and strengths, to further develop potential and to serve God and others

Top 10 Factors to Consider in Course Planning

1. Time and Resources to live a BALANCED life (as much as possible - emotionally, intellectually, physically, socially, spiritually)
2. MEI grade promotion criteria
3. MEI Graduation Program requirements
4. MEI course pre & co-requisites
5. Individual academic strengths & weaknesses
6. Individual interest, ability and spiritual giftedness
7. Exploration of a variety of life / educational experiences
8. Future life & realistic career goals
9. Post-secondary options (within the context of balance, educational experiences, strengths, gifts, weaknesses, reality etc.)
10. University / College entrance requirements (reality vs. myth)

Grade Promotion

- ❑ **Grade 10 Required Courses** (English, Math, Science, Socials, CLE, Bible) that are not completed satisfactorily must be repeated :
 1. at MEI next year **OR**
 2. in summer school (if available) **OR**
 3. Online

- ❑ **Students must pass Bible 10 in order to return to MEI the following year.**

MEI Graduation Program

Students must complete a minimum of 80 grade 10 – 12 credits (16 of the 80 credits must be grade 12 credits)

This includes:

- ❑ 64 Required Credits
- ❑ 16 Elective Course Credits (minimum)

Required Credits (64 credits)

- Bible 10, 11, 12
- Career Life Education (CLE) during your Grade 10 year
- Career Life Connections including Capstone Projects (CLC) during your Grade 12 year
- Literary Studies 10 & Composition 10
- Literary Studies 11 AND English Studies 12
- A Mathematics 10 AND 11
- An Arts Education AND/OR An Applied, Design, Skills, and Technologies in grade 10, 11 or 12
- Social Studies 10
- Exploration in Social Studies 11 OR a Social Study 12 Course (20th Century World History 12, Physical Geography 12, or Law Studies 12)
- Science 10 AND a Science 11 course
- Physical Health Education 10

Three Graduation Assessments

- **One Graduation Numeracy Assessment (GNA) written in Grade 10.**
- **Two Graduation Literacy Assessments (GLA) one written in Grade 10 and the other one in Grade 12.**
- **Does not count as part of your Math or English school marks but will receive a proficiency rating**
- **Similar to the Foundational Skills Assessments (FSA) in Grade 4 and 7**

Arts Education (AE) and/or Applied, Design, Skills, and Technologies (ADST)

Students must complete 4 grade 10, 11 or 12 AE and/or ADST credits in order to meet graduation requirements.

- * Grade 10, 11 and 12 Provincially Authorized AE  and ADST  Courses do meet this graduation requirement.
- * Only Grade 11 Board Authority Authorized (BAA) AE  and ADST  Courses do meet this graduation requirement, not Grade 10 or 12 BAAs

MEI's e-Career Life Education (CLE) 10 Online Course

* IS for students who are self-disciplined, self-motivated, like working independently and are comfortable and proficient in using computer technology and communication software.

* is NOT for students who need parents to remind them about school work and/or who have difficulty completing school work on time

❖ Students are not entitled to a study if they take the CLE online course

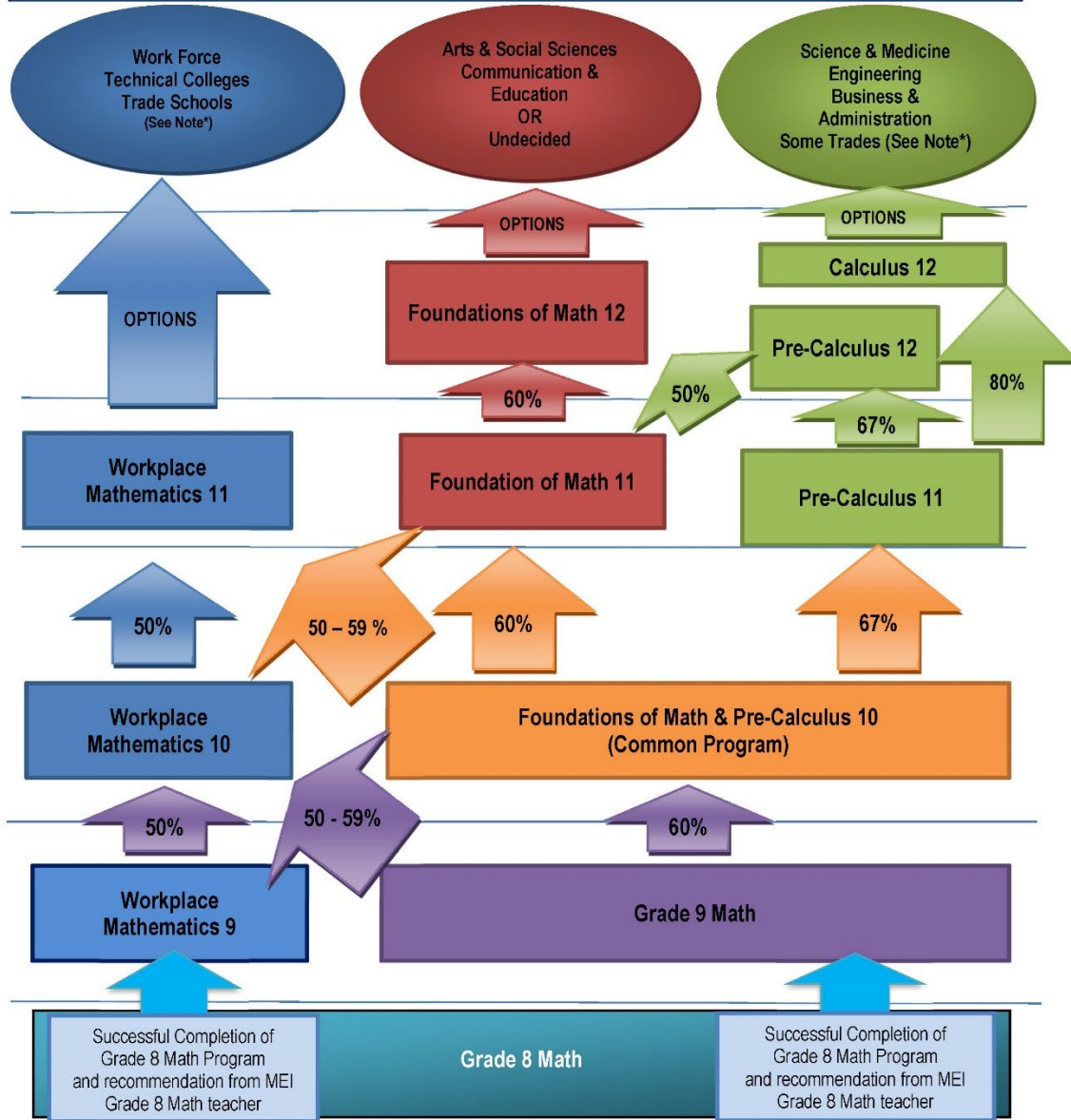
* Opportunity to take one more 2 credits elective

Some Grade 11 Pre-requisites









French, Spanish 11	60% in French 10 or Spanish 10
Foundation of Math 11	60% in FMPC 10
Pre-Calculus 11	67% in FMPC 10
Chemistry 11 & Physics 11	67% in Science 10 & FMPC 10, Enrolled in FOM 11 or PREC 11
Chemistry 11 Honours	Recommendation of the teacher
Physical Geography 12	67% in Social 10 or 60% in Explorations in Social Studies 11
20th Century World History 12	73% in Social 10 or 67% in Explorations in Social Studies 11
Law Studies 12	67% in Social 10 for grade 11 or 50% for grade 12
Life Science 11	60% in Science 10

NOTE: Some trades schools (e.g. Electrical at BCIT) require Pre-Calculus 11 or 12. Some post-secondary institutions (e.g. UBC Okanagan or UVF) do not have a mathematics pre-requisite preference as part of their admission. Please consult the general or program specific admission requirements of any PSI of your choice to know in advance what mathematics pre-requisite they are asking for.

French or Spanish 11



As you are considering whether or not to carry on your education with a second language, it is important to take into account the following information:

- In order to take French or Spanish 11 or 12 at MEI students must have previously successfully completed French 10 or Spanish 10. So, if you did not take French or Spanish 10 this year you will not be able to carry on in a second language in grade 11, and 12 until you have met that pre-requisite.
- A second language IS optional in Grades 9-12. You do not need any second language to graduate

Choosing Courses with Pre-requisites

Course Selection should be based on a student's final mark in the required pre-requisite course, however, if the required pre-requisite course is being taken in the second semester, students should base their course selection on their final mark in the required course the previous year. Students will still need to end up with the required pre-requisite in their requested course by the end of the semester, unless a Department Head or Teacher Designate waives the pre-requisite using a Course Permission Slip.

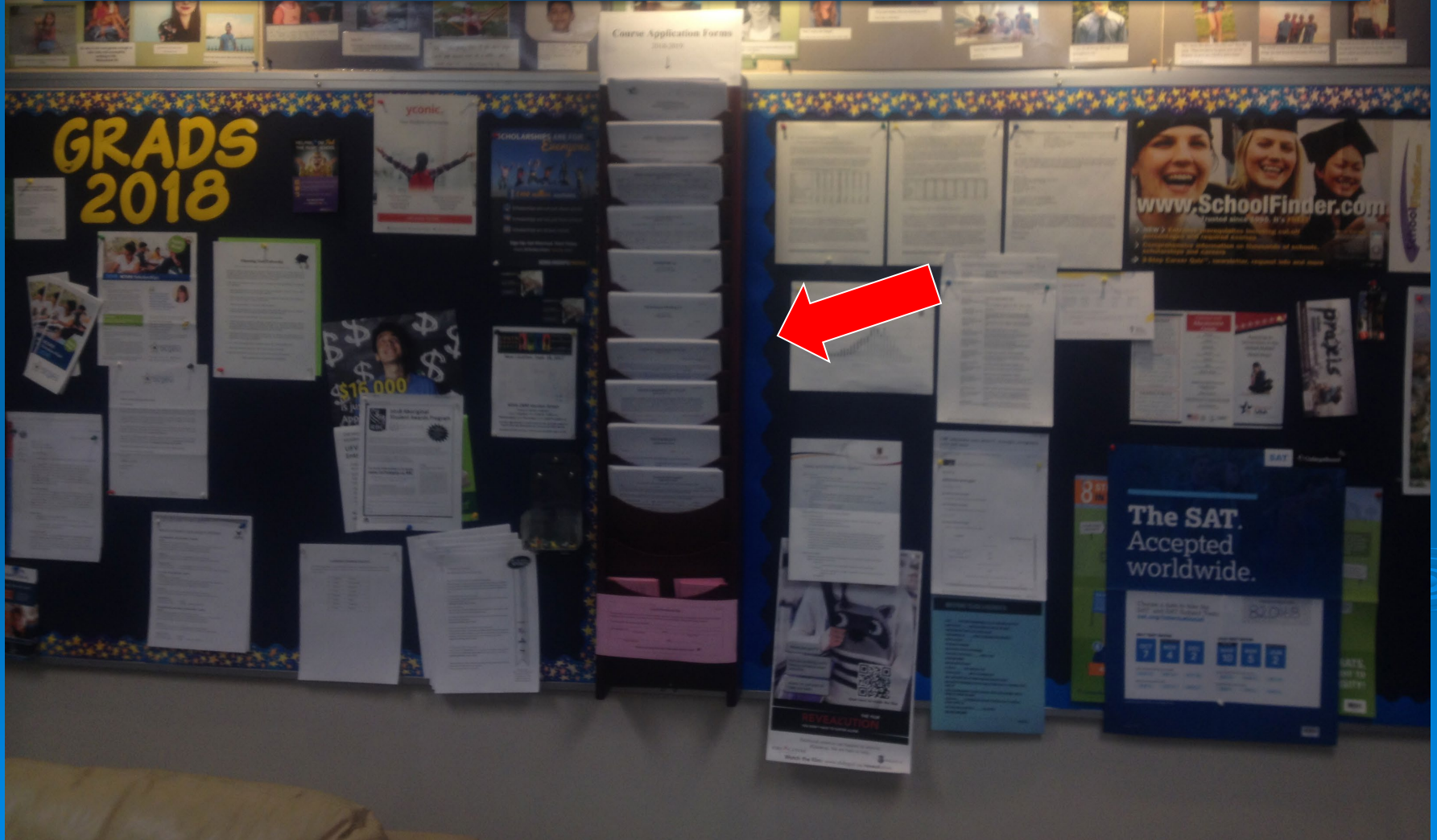

- Visit a campus: Open House & View Days
- BC Post Secondary Annual Event (September)

B.C. Second Language Information



Some things to consider:

- * A grade 11 second language IS required for direct general admission to SFU (SFU will accept an Introductory Language 11) and UBC, but is NOT required at BCIT, TWU, UFV, UVIC and most other B.C. colleges and Bible colleges.
- * If a student completes a full year of approved transferable post-secondary courses/credits at another institution, and then wants to transfer to SFU/UBC*, SFU/UBC* will not require a grade 11 second language.

NOTE: A second language 12 (or equivalent) is NOT required for general admission to UBC, but IS required as part of their Bachelor of Arts degree program.

Post-Secondary Institution (PSI) Admission Requirements

PSI's often have general admission requirements and program specific admission requirements:

- General Admission Requirements:
 - allow a student to “get their foot in the door”
 - are the basic requirements necessary to apply
- Program Specific Admission Requirements
 - allow students to qualify for a specific program at the PSI (the Program Specific Admission Requirements are usually in addition to General Admission Requirements)
